A Reading from Book of Exodus 24: (12-18)

¹² The LORD said to Moses, ‘Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.’ ¹³ So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. ¹⁴ To the elders he had said, ‘Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them.’ ¹⁵ Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. ¹⁶ The glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. ¹⁷ Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. ¹⁸ Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

A Reading from 2Peter 1: (16-21)

16 For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. 17 For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved,* with whom I am well pleased.' 18 We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. 19 So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. 20 First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, 21 because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.*

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves.² And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white.³ Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him.⁴ Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I⁺ will make three dwellings⁺ here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.'⁵ While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved;⁺ with him I am well pleased; listen to him!'⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear.⁷ But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.'⁸ And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'

Meditation: "Morning Star"


Epiphany began with magi following a star. The season that began with one star now ends with another. Amid the glory of the Lord like a devouring fire (*Exod. 24:17*), the face and garments of Christ as dazzling as the sun, and everyone overshadowed by a bright cloud (*Matt. 17:2, 5*), that second star is easy to miss. There it is, nevertheless: "Be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts" (*2Peter 1:19*). What the ancients called the Morning Star we now know as Venus, the planet between Earth and the sun that appears just after sunset and just before sunrise. Besides the sun and the moon, it was the most luminous object in the sky. Because it appeared in the darkness to herald the dawn, early Christians used it to name Jesus, "the root and descendant of David, the bright morning star" (*Rev. 22:16b*). Throughout the time Epiphany, sparkling off the surface of Jesus' baptismal water, the glory of God has gathered intensity. Today it reaches its brightest as the friends of Jesus get to see him for a moment as he truly is. Be attentive to this: to the story through which the community has seen the face and heard the voice of God; to the eyewitness testimony that the light has come from outside and beyond us to shine among and within us. In the dark night of Lent we will need the lamplight of encouragement and promise. Today's morning star points toward the Easter Vigil, when we will celebrate in the light of the paschal candle: "May Christ the Morning Star find it burning, that Morning Star who never sets, that Morning Star who, rising from the grave, faithfully sheds light on the whole human race" (Easter proclamation). This star--rising in our hearts--links Epiphany and resurrection. (Augsburg Fts)
